

MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

Erev Rosh HaShanah 5784 The Great Becoming

There have only been a few times in my life when a work of art or a form of art has taken my breath away. Some in this room may be lucky or savvy enough for this to happen on a regular basis but for me it is more elusive. A few years ago, I encountered a form of religious art, a sand mandala, that stems from the Tibetan Buddhist tradition. Standing around a table, Tibetan monks sketch and proceed to fill in intricate designs of deities using tiny funnels filled with colorful sand. Sometimes taking weeks to finish, the artists practice patience and stamina with the intention that the viewer will reach a state of purification and awe. Once completed, the sand mandalas are methodically deconstructed with brushes and the is sand collected in a jar. They take the jar to a body of water so that the sand can return to its place of origin. We can almost say dayenu, it would have been enough that precious hours were spent making beautiful works of art but then they are swept away never to be seen in that form again reminding us that nothing in life is permanent. On Rosh HaShanah it might seem a bit strange to begin by talking about another religion's rite. While distinctly Buddhist, the philosophy of the sand mandala correlates to what we are doing here tonight.

Rosh HaShanah, the head of the new year. The Hebrew word for year, *Shana*, is not just year, it relates to the word *shoneh*, to change. From one year to the next, we highlight the changes in our lives. This holiday asks us to review our year, admire it, and then sweep it away with the recognition that it will never be seen in that form again, just like the sand of the mandala. Rosh HaShanah reminds us that we cannot hold on to time, the new moon is here and with it a new year, 5784.

We seem to recognize our desire for things to stay the same at the exact moment they are changing. At a pivotal moment in the Torah, Moses asks to see God's face. He is in the midst of great change; he is chosen by God to be the leader of the people. Moses believes in God because of the miracles God brought to the Israelites but he hedges a bit on the mountain. Who can blame him? Moses, our greatest teacher, wishes things would stay the same at the very moment they are going to change. We know this because the next three books of the Torah are all about him. Sensing Moses' desire to feel and know the Ultimate, the Unknowable, God tucks Moses in the cleft of a rock and God's presence passes by him. Moses was able to feel the warmth, the power pass by him and see God's back. But that wasn't all that happened in this moment. God also spoke, telling Moses that he will know me by name. Ehveh-Asher-Evheh. often translated as I will be what I will be. Rabbi Lawrence Kushner teachers that instead of "I will be what I will be," we might understand this complicated syntax as God's name as "I am not done yet." At this moment of ultimate change for Moses, God is also saying I am not done yet. I am change. "My name is in flux, dynamic, the one who is not yet."

If God tells Moses and by extension, us, that God is not

done; how much the more so can we also claim our not-doneness?

Since joining the temple this past summer, I have been getting to know people. They have been sharing their family history, who is related to whom, which gets complicated around here. I have also heard stories of people attending the temple on Collingwood Avenue and the history of this building, even going to the second basement and storage room that is like going back in time. However, the history of The Temple – Congregation Shomer Emunim is legendary. Forgive me if you know this already but here is a bit that I learned, excerpted and abbreviated from our website. "Congregation Shomer Emunim was founded in 1870, and then was dissolved, but by 1875 the congregation was reorganized as a Reform congregation, with services being held in storerooms and homes. The name of the congregation, selected by Rabbi Isaac Mayer Wise, founder of Reform Judaism in America, was "Shomer Emunim - Guardian of the Faithful," taken from the Book of Isaiah (26:2) "Open the gates, and let a righteous nation enter, [a nation] that keeps the faith."

The first place of worship was a small church rented from a Christian congregation located on 11th Street between Madison and Jefferson in downtown Toledo. In 1879, the community decided to raise the then grand sum of \$12,500 to build a Sanctuary.

23 years later, the congregation moved to a larger building on Scottwood Avenue between Monroe and Bancroft. In 1916, with a growing membership, the congregation built a major new synagogue on Collingwood Avenue. By 1950, Reform Judaism was a vital and flourishing movement, and the building was enlarged. In 1973, our beautiful edifice on Sylvania Avenue was built and dedicated."

This congregation is historic and has been through a great deal of change. 150 years ago, in 1873, the temple was dissolved much like the Buddhist monk's mandala. Formed, wiped away, and eventually recreated in 1875 by the most important historical figure in Judaism in the United States. Over time, buildings were occupied, purchased, renovated, and vacated to fit the needs of the community. Never for a moment did this congregation cease to recreate itself, growing and contracting with time.

In some ways the temple has seen a lot of stability and in other ways there has been a lot of change. There has been staff turnover, some expected and some unexpected, that has required this community to come together in ways that they may not have had to do otherwise. The size of the community ballooned to great heights in the 1950s through the 1990's like all other temples and churches across America and have now settled lower than some people like. And yet, there are bright spots, since my arrival in Sylvania, I have officiated a baby naming in the chapel. We have over 100 students in the religious school. And there are 11 kids in the toddler classroom at the Gan preschool, the vast majority of whom are members of the temple.

One of the distinct changes is that we have an all-female professional staff for the first time ever in the congregation's history. While not novel in the landscape of Reform Judaism today, we can consider how that will shape who we are and how we will lead a congregation like ours.

Throughout the High Holy Days, we think about our own personal growth, which I highly recommend we continue doing. AND this is a time to consider how we are becoming as a temple community.

We must recognize our ever-unfolding story. There are no hard stops, just moments that draw our attention to what is happening around us. Ehyeh-Asher-Ehyer, just as God is becoming, we are also becoming.

Our big questions for this new year or 5784 is – What will The Temple- Congregation Shomer Emunim be? How will we rise to the challenges of being a Jewish community in 2023? How can we change and grow to be serve the community that we already have and attract a new generation

of children and adults? How will we support what we have and continue to grow?

As I have been meeting people, I have been asking what they love about the temple and how can the temple meet their needs today. I have heard about the desire for deep connection and spirituality, figuring out how to stay connected after kids leave home, how to reach out to interfaith families and make them feel more comfortable, how to get the teens back involved and how to engage young adults and young families, and how to use our building lovingly and efficiently. These questions and more are our "becoming" questions, the creation of our temple mandala as it is today and dreaming what it can be in the future.

May this new year be one of searching and finding, fulfillment and action. May it grant us the space to change and to return to our better selves while dreaming of how we can become more together in community. May this year allow to draw nearer to Ehyeh Asher Ehyeh, the Great Becoming. Shana tova!



Thank You




