MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

It is going to take a long time for the Jewish world to process what happened in Israel on October 7th. Since that day Israel has changed, Gaza has changed, Israel-American relations have changed, antisemitism around the world has changed, as have we. Listening to an interview on a podcast called Unholy: Two Jews in the News with one of the top journalists in Israel, Ilana Dayan, she said, that "today is still October 7th and every day since then is and every day until all of the hostages are released will it be October 7th." I lived in Israel in 2000 and 2004, when we were learning about the bus bombings during the Second Intifada, I always heard the message that yes, these things happen and we just keep moving along with our lives. Unfortunately, that mindset seems to have shifted after the attack in October because everyone is related to someone or knows someone who has died or who has been called up for duty. Israel is still reeling and the entire region is suffering.

This moment is also different in terms of the narratives being disseminated through all streams of media. I do not want to cede my column's space to the hatred that is out there. This month, I want to share a list of websites, articles, Instagram and TikTok handles of people who are discussing the war in Israel with a level head, who are reporting thoroughly and thoughtfully.

If you would like to read and learn more about Israel along with me, I am hosting two book conversations about the book by Noa Tishby, an Israeli actress and advocate, A Simple Guide to the Most Misunderstood Country on Earth. Please find this book and join me either on Zoom on February 6 at 2pm or in person, at the temple on February 7 at 7pm.

May this new year of 2024 bring peace to all those who are suffering.



Deadline for scholarship application is Wednesday, February 1, 2024

Once again, the Temple Board, W.A.T.S. and Temple Brotherhood have set aside some money for campers who are attending Jewish camps this summer. The camper MUST meet the following criteria:

- 1) Applicant must be a member in good standing of the Temple.
- 2) Applicant must be enrolled in and meet attendance requirements for the Temple Religious School during the year of the request.
- 3) Request must be for attendance at a URJ camp, or any other non-denominational Jewish camp (i.e., JCC run camp)
- 4) Must be an overnight camp.
- 5) Applicant must submit request in writing by February 1, 2024



LIBRARY NEWS



Happy New Year! I hope everyone's holidays were fun and happy. Vacation is a great time to catch up on your reading. Our library has many fine books on Jewish subjects for you to enjoy.

I found a copy of Chaim Potok's first novel The Chosen, the story of an unlikely friendship between the son of a Russian Hasidic Rebbe and the son of an Orthodox Talmud scholar and teacher. They met playing baseball on opposing teams in the 1940's during World War II. The deeply conservative Hasidim looked down on the more modern Yeshiva that taught more English subjects than required and taught its Jewish subjects in Hebrew rather than Yiddish. The Hasidim played with great fervor because they hated the more modern Yeshiva. It is one of my favorite books.

For more insight into Hasidism, we have In Praise of the Baal Shem Tov translated by Dan Ben Amos and Jerome R. Mintz. It was originally published in Hebrew and in Yiddish in 1815. It tells us about time gone by and the faith of the Hasidim followers of the Baal Shem Tov, the founder of the movement of Jewish Mysticism that was so powerful in Russia.

We will have Temple Book Club on Thursday, January 11 at 10:30AM in the Temple Lounge. I will discuss the book by Cathleen Schine, Kunstlers in Paradise. The public library system has 10 copies.

In 1939, the Kunstlers escaped Vienna just as Hitler was about to annex Austria. They fled to the colony of Jewish artists and writers in Southern California. The name of the town that was their new home was Paradise. There in nearby Hollywood, they found many other Jewish writers and musicians including Thomas Mann, Arnold Schoenberg, Christofer Isherwood, and even Greta Garbo.

ELIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The primary criteria for an award are both academic achievement and financial need.

- Applicant's family must be a member in good standing of The Temple Congregation Shomer Emunim.
- \$10,000 Award <u>one time for one year</u> for any Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior. Cannot be combined with scholarship from the Foundation.
- Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Applicant must be entering an accredited undergraduate program as a full-time student at the University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University, Owens Community College, or Lourdes College.
- Applicant must be between the ages of 17 and 25 years.
- Applicant must apply in writing to The Temple Shomer Emunim Rabbi's Scholarship, underwritten by the Donald
- **L. Solomon Foundation** in care of Temple Shomer Emunim, 6453 Sylvania Avenue, Sylvania, Ohio 43560, Attention: Lynn Nusbaum, Temple Administrator.
