



A miracle lives among us

A miracle lives among us at Temple Shomer Emunim. It is a small Czech Torah from the town of Bucovice that survived the Holocaust.

Throughout the Holocaust, our Czech Scroll #186 was safely out of view in a decrepit, tiny suburban Prague synagogue.

It was one of 1,564 Czech Torahs and Haftorahs carefully placed there by Jews who worked at the Jewish Museum of Prague. They made certain to save the scrolls and many other Jewish objects from around the nation before the staff were deported. Only two specialist workers from the Jewish Museum of Prague were still alive when World War II ended.

Just before the Holocaust, 118,310 Jews lived in the Czech lands. Of those, about 26,000 managed to emigrate to safety. More than 78,000 were murdered by the Nazis.

The Holocaust ended in 1945. In 1948, the Soviet Communist Party seized control and ruled the nation for four decades. Once again, the lives and religion of Jews were in danger.

Our Czech Torah and the other scrolls continued to be stored in Michle Synagogue on the outskirts of Prague. Communists knew the scrolls were there, and they considered the scrolls of zero value to the nation.

Sixty years ago, the Czech Scrolls were rescued a second time.

An American art professor, Eric Estorick, had become a London art dealer and was doing an annual buying trip in 1963 behind the "Iron Curtain". While in Prague, he was told by officials about the existence of the Czech Scrolls. Eric was taken to see the scrolls, and informed that the Communist officials needed more funds and wanted to sell the entire collection of "worthless" religious texts.

Eric contacted key leaders of Westminster Synagogue. Steps began that culminated in a congregant donating funds that

ransomed the scrolls. An academic team of experts from the UK went to inspect the scrolls, determine how they could be protected during transport, plus plan the transportation details. Each scroll had to be wrapped in linen in a manner that preserved the parchment (often badly damaged), before each was shipped to London. Also, rabbinical courts in both London and Jerusalem were consulted to make sure everything that was done was approved.

In November 1963, final payment was made to the Communists.

On February 4, 2024 Jews from throughout the UK and the world returned to Westminster Synagogue and the Czech Memorial Scrolls Trust to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the rescue of the scrolls.

The mission and Jewish life inside that London synagogue changed forever on the February 1964 day when the scrolls were carried individually into the grand hall. The congregation became committed to restoring as many as possible. The goal was to reawaken nearly every scroll to a new phase of vibrant Jewish life. This was accomplished one by one as they were released to "guardian" synagogues, Jewish schools, hospitals and other organizations. The majority—more than 1,000—are in North America.

Rabbi Alan Sokobin made certain to request one of the Czech Torahs for Temple Shomer Emunim when our congregation was preparing to move from the Old West End to Sylvania. His best friend from rabbinical school, Albert Friedlander, had just become the rabbi of Westminster Synagogue.

Czech Scroll 186 arrived safely in London on February 7, 1964. In 1966, Communist officials destroyed Bucovice Synagogue — its original home. It reached us in 1973. And now we protect it, and the memory of those who originally worshipped with it.

She asks, "Where is God in the Purim story?" Her father says, "He is hidden in the faith of Mordecai and Esther and in their courage to do the right thing."
- 2) **QUEEN ESTHER, THE MORNING STAR** by Mordicai Gersten. This is a beautifully written and illustrated retelling of the Purim story.
- 3) **GOLDIE'S PURIM** by Jane Breskin Zalben. Goldie is Queen Esther in the Purim play at Temple, and she is afraid. Will she remember her lines? Goldie pulls herself together, and, brave like Esther, says her lines loudly to great applause. Then, everyone enjoys the party and the Hamantaschen.


