MESSAGE FROM RABBI JAMIE GIBSON

Until quite recently, the most observed ritual in all of Jewish life was the Passover Seder. There were clear and obvious reasons for this:

Seder is most often held in the home, not at synagogue – At home there is no Rabbi (or Cantor) telling you what to do! You can dress as you want (although I always dress up for ours) and you are supposed to sit in comfy chairs with cushions.

Seder (at its best) is intergenerational – A good seder has (we hope) 3 generations, sometimes even 4! And each of those generations has different tastes, styles, preferences and tolerances for what a Seder should be. Many of us have powerful memories of sitting at a kids' table, deeply engrossed in our own games while passionate discussion or Hebrew chanting went on at the other end.

Seders vary in content and duration - For some, the briefest of Seders is best – "We were slaves. Now we're free! Where's the soup?" While for others there is a deep curiosity about the themes of the Seder, from the ongoing quest for freedom throughout the world to how to care for the earth and every topic in between. I've led or taken part in inter-racial Seders, interfaith seders, feminist seders, LGBTQ seders, you name it. I draw the line at churches who appropriate our ritual for their theology as opposed to affirming our people's sacred history.

Seders involve all five senses – The sight of a well put together Seder table can warm the heart. The sounds of everyone, especially kids, banging on tables while singing the song "Dayenu," lifts the soul. The feel of water on one's hands for washing, the splashing of parsley into salt water and putting together a "Hillel sandwich, all involve our sense of touch. A good dollop of horseradish for bitter herbs (whew!) knocks back our olfactory sense. And the foods! Oh my goodness! What families create with their Passover recipes is the stuff of joy and dreams! Which leads to the final reason Seder has been so popular over the years

Seders involve food. Lots and lots of food – In our house, the preparation for two Seders involves several days of preparation, from cleaning the kitchen and finding all of our dishes and cutlery for Passover (we have a kosher home) to deciding which of Barbara's recipes will be featured this year. We don't eat a lot of meat during the year, but Passover, I admit, is a meat fest. One of my sons spent an entire school year as a vegetarian until he realized he would be giving up enjoying his favorite dishes for Passover. He gave up vegetarianism for Seder. Oh well...

Any Seder you and your family takes part in is better than having no Seder at all. So, I wish each of you a joyous Pesach, filled with family love, heartfelt laughter, shared story and song and delicious food.

Most important, I wish for all of us the sense that each one of us is connected to our people by this story no matter how old we are, no matter where we live, no matter what our national or ethnic background. Our story of national liberation is the most Jewish of stories and one the world needs to hear as well.



Preparing Your Passover Seder First Seder is Wednesday evening, April 5, 2023

Beitzah (Egg)-A roasted egg, symbolizing the continuing cycle of life. There are also those who see the egg as a symbol of the Jewish people's will to survive. Just as the egg becomes harder the longer it cooks, so the Jewish people have emerged from the crucible of persecution as a strong and living people.

Karpas-A vegetable, usually green such as parsley, symbolizing spring and its spirit of hope, as well as the Jews undying faith in the future.

Shank Bone-a roasted bone, symbolizing the paschal offering brought to the Temple in Jerusalem in ancient times. Many Jews see the shank bone as a symbol of God's outstretched arms, helping Jewish people in times of trouble.



Salt Water-Symbolizing the tears our ancestors shed in Egypt.

A Cup of Wine is placed at each table setting. The sanctification of the holiday is pronounced over the first cup. Three additional cups are drunk during the course of the Seder, making a total of four to symbolize the four expressions of the Lord's promise to redeem the children of Israel and deliver them from bondage.

Matzah-Three matzah, placed one on top of the other, are used during the Seder. They are seen as symbolic of the three categories of Jews: priests (Kohanim), Levites, and Israelites.



Charoset-A mixture of chopped apples, nuts, wine and spices symbolizing the mortar that our ancestors used to make bricks in Egypt. (To make Charoset, peel, core, and chop 8-10 large apples. Add 10-12oz. of chopped pecans, almonds, and/or walnuts, 1 ½ cups sweet wine, 1 Tbsp. cinnamon and 4 Tbsp. sugar).

Maror-The bitter herbs, usually a horseradish root, symbolizing the bitterness that our forefathers experienced as slaves in Egypt, and in a contemporary sense, the lot of all who are enslaved.

Haggadah-(the telling) contains the complete Seder ceremonies in their prescribed order (seder).

The first part of the book, concerned mainly with the story of the Jews deliverence from Egypt. It is read before the meal. After dinner follows the second portion consisting of prayers of praise and thanks to the Almighty.



Elijah's Cup

A special cup filled with wine, placed prominently on the table. According to legend, Elijah visits every home on Passover and drinks from his cup.

Candles are lighted to usher in the festival of Passover. The benediction which is pronounced over the candles gives a religious meaning to this simple act. An abundance of light symbolizes joy and festivity.



Passover begins in the evening on Wednesday, April 5. Temple will be having a First Night Seder, starting at 5:30 PM led by Cantor Jen Roher. Happy Passover to everyone. Our Temple has many Haggadahs you can borrow when you hold your own Seder service at your home: the old UNION HAGGADAH and the newer version from the Central Conference of American Rabbis, THE OPEN DOOR. This refers to the time during the service when we open the door for Elijah the Prophet. We also have some Maxwell House Haggadahs and a lovely one just for children.

For very young children, I recommend HOORAY! IT'S PASSOVER by Leslie Kimmelman, illustrated by John Himmelman. This book offers very simple explanations of the Passover Seder and its basic rituals. HAPPY PASSOVER, ROSIE by Jane Breskin Zalben does the same and tells the story of Rosie, who is worried because she must recite the Four Questions for the first time. Of course, all goes well.
