MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

I do not consider myself a runner. However, I have so much respect and admiration for people who are. A while back, I was listening to a podcast called Unorthodox by Tablet Magazine. They consider themselves the "world's leading Jewish podcast." In this particular episode, the hosts interviewed sports writer, Matthew Futterman, about his book called Running on the Edge, about the meditative qualities of running. As someone with limited knowledge about competitive running, I have accomplished exactly two 5k runs in my whole life. It never occurred to me that just like in preparing for other competitive sports, or a big meeting, or an interview, one would need to mentally prepare to run. Perhaps if I had this knowledge, my own running, or let's be honest - jogging, would have been more enjoyable and meaningful than when I left my front door with headphones and sneakers and came back with a cramp in my side.

The idea of preparation is deeply embedded in the month leading up to the High Holy Days, the Hebrew month of Elul, which begins on August 17. Throughout this month, we mentally and physically prepare for Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur. These thirty days plus ten that lead us to Yom Kippur offer us the time to consider what it means to be humans in the bodies that we inhabit. We can consider what kind of person we are in our relationships. We can imagine the kind of person that we want to be in our relationship with God and in relation to our Jewish lives.

Just like with running without mental preparation, the High Holy Days without mental preparation can lead to a headache rather than a cramp in our side. We cannot expect to walk into the temple on Erev Rosh HaShanah and get the full meaning of Avinu Malkeinu without preparing ourselves in some way. How much the more so walking into the Sanctuary on Kol Nidre, standing and annulling our vows that we have made in the past and those that we might make in the future. Without preparation we do not build context for this deep experience of self-reflection.

Just like the book on running practices and drills, I would like to offer a few practices that we can use during the month of Elul to truly reap the benefits of thousands of years of our tradition.

Reading: The Jewish people have been described as the People of the Book for generations. Our practice is tied up with the ritual reading of the Torah and all of the Rabbinic and mystical texts that follow. While those texts are the cornerstone of Jewish thought, there are many more that offer insight on what it means to be a contemporary Jewish person or Jewish-adjacent person in our modern world. This reading does not supplant secular reading during the month of Elul; rather supplement our spiritual introspection and growth. Some of my favorite Elul reads are This is Real and You Are Completely Unprepared by Rabbi Alan Lew z"l. This brief book offers practices and context for the entire High Holy Day season. Another one of my favorite books on this topic is Einstein and the Rabbi by Rabbi Naomi Levy, which offers lines of connection between our souls and the universe.

Journaling: Writing down our thoughts and feelings in a

non-judgmental way is one way of preparing ourselves for the deep soul work of the High Holy Days. Journaling can be as free-form as writing down lessons learned from the day, or just a record of what happened. It can also be structured. For example, at the end of each day, write down five things for which you are grateful. If you would like a guided experience, Rabbis Kerry M. Olitzky and Rachel T. Sabath offer a guided journal that explores Psalm 27, the psalm connected to the High Holy Days called *Preparing Your Heart for the High Holy Days*.

Walk or hike: Hasidic master, Rabbi Nachman of Braslav's students used to say: "Our rabbi, of blessed memory, even though he had a separate room in the village where he lived by himself, would nonetheless usually go over the fields into the woods; and he would seclude himself there. While [walking] around the fields and the mountains; he stretched his hand toward the fields and mountains and said to me: 'On all these fields and mountains which you see around the town...I have walked several times.'" He continued on by saying, "it is good to go out for a 'talk in the field.' This 'talk' is prayer and supplication to God, and then all the shrubs of the field, which start to live and grow, yearn and are included in one's prayer and plea."^[1]

When we go out into nature, we are giving ourselves the opportunity to recognize our place in the world. While our daily life is full of details, calendars, and errands - nature is the opposite. It frees us from the hardships of life and helps us remember that we are one small being in a grand universe. This sort of preparation allows us to enter the High Holy Day season with humility.

At this time of year, each of these seemingly secular activities have the power to truly connect us to our tradition. They offer us time and space to get in touch with our better selves, allow us to look up from our day-to-day lives, and spiritually prepare ourselves for our Jewish high holy day marathon.

Wednesday, August 30 at 7 pm - no experience necessary




