MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

TRADITION, TRADITION:


When we see these two words, tradition - tradition, we might start singing and snapping our fingers. The rest of the chorus adds some pep into our step but, just like Tevye, I will never know what it is like to be a rich man, since I am a woman. All joking aside, traditions are very important, they offer us grounding and comfort. And they can also be tricky. When tradition is synonymous with the phrase "this is the way we have always done it," then for whomever the tradition is not theirs, it can cause discomfort.

It is also a very Jewish idea, *minhag ha'makom*, translated as 'the custom of the place.' *Minhag ha'makom* is a powerful tool that the ancient rabbis used when deciding whether an action was allowed for a particular ritual at the time of their ruling. What was acceptable in Babylonia might not have been acceptable in Israel. We see this example played out in the difference between Ashkenazi and Sephardi Passover food practices. It is also present here in how we chant the Amidah and stand from Bar'chu to Shema during services.

We are coming up on a time of the year that is steeped in "tradition." The High Holy Days are an elevated time of year, what we do matters during this ten-day period. Each family and each person has their own practice. Some people make the same menu for Rosh HaShanah dinner every single year. Some families only come to Rosh HaShanah morning services and Kol Nidre and wouldn't think of coming to the other services. Others wouldn't dream of missing their pre-fast meal with their extended family. Still there are others for whom the practices of Judaism are new and this is their first time celebrating the High Holy Days. They might be feeling left out. This is why traditions are tricky. They vary from place to place and person to person. Each of the communities that I have served since Rabbinical school have had their own customs and traditions. That is what makes each community unique.

This year also breaks a tradition that goes back to 1875, back to the beginning of The Temple Congregation Shomer Emunim, having a full-time female-identified rabbi lead the congregation. My voice will be different, my appearance will be different, the words that I use to introduce the prayers and the ideas that I offer will be different. When traditions are broken or even altered slightly, it can be uncomfortable. Of course, it won't be uncomfortable for everyone but I would like to offer the space for acknowledgement if it is. AND I invite everyone to be open-minded to the opportunity for new traditions, new words, new ways of thinking about these special days in our year. Judaism, and especially Reform Judaism, are not stagnant. We are not "Reformed" but we are "Reform." It is a verb. It is ever-changing and growing, moving with the tides of the moment while also holding on to what is dear.

As someone new to this community, I look forward to learning your traditions and I hope you will embrace the new traditions that we will create together in the years to come.






The Difficulty of Forgiveness

These items will be sorted and delivered to their proper places by our Religious School students.



LIBRARY NEWS



On Thursday, July 20, the Book Clubs of all three synagogues met at Congregation B'nai Israel for our annual Joint Book Club Meetings to discuss **THE MATCHMAKER'S GIFT** by Lynda Cohen Loigman. The meeting was a tremendous success. Forty-one women attended! We all had a great time and all three congregations were well represented.

I gave a short history of Jewish Matchmaking. The role of the Shadchan goes back to Biblical times and served to find wealthy brides for poor Torah scholars and helped to unite far flung communities, thus unifying the Jews of Europe and keeping communities genetically more diverse.

Carol Richman, from B'nai Israel, gave us background on the author, who has a Bachelor of Arts in English and American Literature from Harvard College and a J.D. from Columbia Law School. Sharon Stein, also from B'nai Israel, led the discussion of this lovely and imaginative book, in which we follow Sara Glickman on New York's Lower East Side from 1910 on as she uses her magic intuition to find soulmates for marriages. After Sara dies, her granddaughter, Abby, finds her journals and begins to make matches, too. She has inherited the gift. We look forward to our next joint meeting in 2024.

We will have our next Temple Book Club after the High Holidays on Thursday, October 12, at 10:30 AM, in the Temple Lounge. Sue Hirsch will discuss **THE LADY IN GOLD** by Anne Marie O'Connor. It is the story of a painting by Austrian painter, Gustave Klimt which was stolen by the Austrian Nazis from the palace of the Bloch-Bauer family in Vienna, displayed in the Belvedere Palace by the Austrian Government, and finally, after years of litigation and a United States Supreme Court ruling, returned to the Bloch-Bauer Family.

As preparation for the High Holidays, I will display several children's and adult books about the Jewish Holidays to help all of us and our children prepare for our New Year, Day of Atonement, and Sukkot.
