MESSAGE FROM RABBI LISA DELSON

Introduction to Judaism

In January, we started a new session of Introduction to Judaism. I expected there to be 10-15 people who were interested in this type of learning. However, our registration has now been capped at 36 people! 36 people are taking on the task of deepening their Jewish knowledge, learning about the history and beliefs in Judaism, and/or joining their family members in this search for meaning. The first class was full of energy and hope as we started asking big questions together. At the end of the class I asked everyone to write their questions anonymously. Here are a few examples:

- What are some of the tension points between Reform Judaism and the more conservative/observant branches of Judaism?
- How involved in temple activities are non-Jewish spouses? Are there temple activities where it is frowned upon for non-Jewish partners to participate?
- If we, as Jewish people, had to move around so much, how have we been able to hold on to tradition so well?
- What is the purpose of a mezuzah and when is it proper to get one?
- What if you are never comfortable with saying the blessings that refer to God? Does that mean you can never fully perform any of the ritual actions?
- How can I place value in being Jewish and being of the community, without being triggered by past experiences in religion?
- What do you think the meaning of life that God created is?
- What is the best way to learn the melodies of the prayers for Shabbat services?

These questions are incredible. They reach to the various parts of Jewish practice and history. One of the main points from our first class was the idea that Judaism is not just a religion and not just an ethnicity but it is a combination of the two. We are a people tied to each other through our sacred texts, rituals, ethnicities, beliefs, and struggles. When we dig into our history, culture, and belief system(s), we are better able to answer these questions with more questions. Our ancient rabbis were, at once, interested in answering specific questions based on their worldview and experience as well as creating space for future generations to come to their own conclusions. As a people living in 2024, with all of our complexities of identities, we, too, can answer these questions based on how we live today with the guidance from the past and imagine how Jewish life will flourish in the future.


One of my favorite books to read and discuss with people choosing Judaism is "Why Be Jewish?" by Rabbi David J. Wolpe. In this short book he suggests that we can answer that question in three parts: 1) To Grow in Soul 2) To Join a People 3) To Seek God. It is my hope that throughout this course I will offer, not just the *tachlis*, details, but also reach to higher heights through asking and answering questions, listening to our inner voice, reaching toward God, and strengthening the Jewish people.

Scholarships are limited to tuition and fees.

ELIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The primary criteria for an award are both academic achievement and financial need.

- Applicant's family must be a member in good standing of The Temple Congregation Shomer Emunim.
- \$10,000 Award one time for one year for any Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior. Cannot be combined with scholarship from the Foundation.
- Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Applicant must be entering an accredited undergraduate program as a full-time student at the University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University, Owens Community College, or Lourdes College.
- Applicant must be between the ages of 17 and 25 years.
- Applicant must apply in writing to The Temple Shomer Emunim Rabbi's Scholarship, underwritten by the Donald
- **L. Solomon Foundation** in care of Temple Shomer Emunim, 6453 Sylvania Avenue, Sylvania, Ohio 43560, Attention: Lynn Nusbaum, Temple Administrator.

Involvement in Hillel and/or Jewish Community life will be taken into consideration at time of any scholarship/grant renewal application.

Deadline for application for the 2024-25 academic school year is May 31, 2024.

The awards committee will consist of the Temple President, Rabbi, Temple Administrator, and Donald L. Solomon.
