## Rabbi Sam Weinstein

Dear Friends:

The holiday of Purim is portrayed as a joyous festival for children. Perhaps it was able to evolve in this fashion because nowhere in the Book of Esther is the name of “God” to be found. It appears more as a tale, than Torah, but the

sages, men of God filled with great insight and wisdom, determined that the Book of Esther should be included in the Biblical canon. They felt that the message of this Book was worthy and worth studying and pondering. What is in this seemingly insignificant book that our sages wanted to preserve?

If we listen to the words of the Book of Esther, not just the name of “Haman” in an attempt to drown out his name with the sounding of the groggers, we open ourselves to a story of political intrigue. Haman, a notorious anti-Semite who seeks personal power not to help the people living in his realm, but to satiate his own appetite for control, has determined that the Jews in the kingdom must be eliminated. There is only one voice in the court of King Ahasverosh who might have any chance of confronting the King with the truth. But how shall Esther go about saving her people? What chance is there that a woman, who essentially at this time in history has virtually no power, can effectuate a political coup d’état that will reveal the evil motives of Haman? How can she, within the confines of her position—remember what happened to Vashti when she was displeasing in the King’s sight—convince her husband, the King, that there is another viewpoint to be considered?

Esther is frightened, but she knows that silence is not an option. **“Do not imagine in your heart that you, of all the Jews, will escape because you are in the King’s palace,”** Mordecai warns her. **“For if you insist on remaining silent at this time, relief and deliverance will come to the Jews from elsewhere, but you and your father’s house will perish.”**

Esther acts, and the result is history. In fact, the course of history is changed. Why? In a closed system where the King heard only the voices of those closest to him, Esther introduces another perspective. Her people are to be annihilated and who is responsible for planning this vile act? Haman, the king’s Prime Minister, the one he has given **“a seat higher than that of all the other nobles!”** This moment changes the King. Armed with a perspective other than Haman’s, the King has Haman eliminated and the Jewish people are spared.

Silence is not an option. Living in this time of extreme

political partisanship, where facts seems to be filtered through the lenses of one’s chosen political preferences, the Book of Esther is a reassuring message. When will we as Americans demand from our elected officials that they manifest the maturity needed to see the validity of other viewpoints? When will we demand that the members of our political parties act civilly toward each other? When will we insist our leaders listen to other ways to approach a problem more than they talk about their own

myopic and parochial perspectives? We have many external enemies, Korea, Iran, Russia and others, but we have taken our eyes off the insidious enemy within that threatens our democracy.

Unless our elected officials learn to distinguish between facts and party propaganda, unless politicians learn to treat each other respectfully even when they are so ideologically different, and unless this happens soon, elected officials will undermine the very nation they have promised to serve. “Our house,” our nation is more important than any political party, news outlet or politician. The Book of Esther reminds us that allegiance to the facts, having the courage to adjust our “personal truths” when confronted with other perspectives is essential in a society if it is to remain vibrant, prosperous and free.

Was it not Haman who had informed him that it was “of no benefit for the king to keep the Jews” (3:8), when here it was written that the Jew had in fact been responsible for saving his life? Perhaps Haman had even been involved in the plot that the Jews had succeeded in foiling? And then there is Haman’s bizarre mania for control, which was what had led Ahashverosh to elevate him in the first place—but which has now empowered Haman to lay a hand on his signet, and on his banquets with his wife, and on who knows what else. ## Preparing Your Passover Seder

### First Seder is Friday evening, March 30, 2018

**Beitzah (Egg)**-A roasted egg, symbolizing the continuing cycle of life. There are also those who see the egg as a symbol of the Jewish people's will to survive. Just as the egg becomes harder the longer it cooks, so the Jewish people have emerged from the crucible of persecution as a strong and living people.

**Shank Bone**-a roasted bone, symbolizing the paschal offering brought to the Temple in Jerusalem in ancient times. Many Jews see the shank bone as a symbol of God's outstretched arms, helping Jewish people in times of trouble.

**Matzah**-Three matzah, placed one on top of the other, are used during the Seder. They are seen as symbolic of the three categories of Jews: priests (Kohanim), Levites, and Israelites.



**Karpas**-A vegetable, usually green such as parsley, symbolizing spring and its spirit of hope, as well as the Jews undying faith in the future.



**Charoset**-A mixture of chopped apples, nuts, wine and spices symbolizing the mortar that our ancestors used to make bricks in Egypt. (To make Charoset, peel, core, and chop 8-10 large apples. Add 10-12oz. of chopped pecans, almonds, and/or walnuts, 1 ½ cups sweet wine, 1 Tbsp. cinnamon and 4 Tbsp. sugar).



**Elijah's Cup**

A special cup filled with wine, placed prominently on the table. According to legend, Elijah visits every home on Passover and drinks from his cup.

**Salt Water**-Symbolizing the tears our ancestors shed in Egypt.

**Maror**-The bitter herbs, usually a horseradish root, symbolizing the bitterness that our forefathers experienced as slaves in Egypt, and in a contemporary sense, the lot of all who are enslaved.

**Candles** are lighted to usher in the festival of Passover. The benediction which is pronounced over the candles gives a religious meaning to this simple act. An abundance of light symbolizes joy and festivity.

**A Cup of Wine** is placed at each table setting. The sanctification of the holiday is pronounced over the first cup. Three additional cups are drunk during the course of the Seder, making a total of four to symbolize the four expressions of the Lord's promise to redeem the children of Israel and deliver them from bondage.

**Haggadah**-(the telling) contains the complete Seder ceremonies in their prescribed order (seder). The first part of the book, concerned mainly with the story of the Jews deliverance from Egypt. It is read before the meal. After dinner follows the second portion consisting of prayers of praise and thanks to the Almighty.

# The Temple Jewish OVERNIGHT Camp Scholarship Information from The Temple Board of Trustees, WRJ and Brotherhood

*Deadline for scholarship application is Friday, March 30, 2018*

Once again, the Temple Board, WRJ/Sisterhood and Temple Brotherhood have set aside some money for campers who are attending Jewish camps this summer. The camper **MUST** meet the following criteria:

- 1) Applicant must be a member in good standing of the Temple.
- 2) Applicant must be enrolled in and meet attendance requirements for the Temple Religious School during the year of the request.
- 3) Request must be for attendance at a URJ camp, or any other non-denominational Jewish camp (i.e., JCC run camp)
- 4) Must be an overnight camp.
- 5) Applicant must submit request in writing by March 30, 2018



## The Temple Shomer Emunim Rabbi's Scholarship Underwritten by the Donald L. Solomon Foundation

Scholarships are limited to tuition and fees.

### ELIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The primary criteria for an award are both **academic achievement and financial need.**

- Applicant's family must be a member in good standing of The Temple Congregation Shomer Emunim.
- \$10,000 Award **one time for one year** for any Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior. Cannot be combined with scholarship from the Foundation.
- Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Applicant must be entering an accredited undergraduate program as a full time student at the University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University,

Owens Community College, or Lourdes College.

- Applicant must be between the ages of 17 and 25 years.
- Applicant must apply in writing to **The Temple Shomer Emunim Rabbi's Scholarship, underwritten by the Donald L. Solomon Foundation** in care of Temple Shomer Emunim, 6453 Sylvania Avenue, Sylvania, Ohio 43560, Attention: Lynn Nusbaum, Temple Administrator.
- Involvement in Hillel and/or Jewish Community life will be taken into consideration at time of any scholarship/grant renewal application.

**Deadline for application for the 2018-19 academic school year is May 31, 2018.**

The awards committee will consist of the Temple President, Rabbi, Temple Administrator, and Donald L. Solomon.

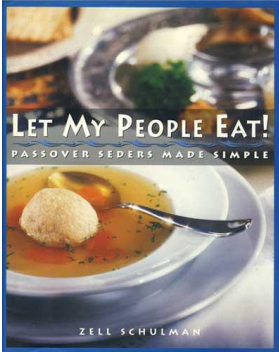

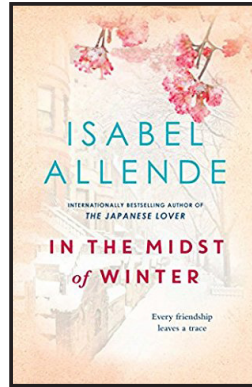

Soon after Hitler came into power in Germany, as part of an all-out cultural purge, certain art was labeled "degenerate" and banned by the Nazis. Jewish artists and musicians were fired and works by many composers including Felix Mendelssohn, Franz Schreker, Kurt Weill and Gustav Mahler, as well as jazz, were defamed; recordings of Jewish musicians and composers forbidden. Those artists of Jewish heritage not forced into exile in other countries were summarily rounded up and sent to concentration camps.

Phillip Silver's research into the composers of this era began with artists who died in the Holocaust, such as Viktor Ullmann, Gideon Klein and Alma Rose, the niece of Gustav Mahler. He found himself drawn to the extraordinary testament to the human spirit that would allow such artists to continue to compose despite the madness all around them. Through the efforts of the Silvers, as well as other scholars and international musicians, modern audiences are rediscovering these composers whose works today are recognized as some of the finest of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Silver was determined that their voices would continue to be heard through their music.
